- 1. Assurance & Capacity Building: Improving confidence in results and the quality of delivery, including supporting partners to improve practice/s through bespoke technical assistance.
- Learning & Innovation: Enabling greater portfolio experimentation by providing closer to realtime insight into progress on the ground, supporting faster course-correction and lesson learning.

- Activity verification (in real-time and/or retrospective)
- Expenditure verification, with potential to include modest-scale financial audits
- Results verification
- Policy compliance assessments to assess how e.g., safeguarding, risk management, or other policies are being implemented in practice
- Beneficiary feedback on programme services or topics of interest e.g., inclusion
- Monitoring & Evaluation capacity assessments and technical assistance to implementing partners, e.g., to improve quality and accuracy of data collection
- Contextual and/or thematic monitoring reports, on a recurring or needs basis

The Team Lead will:

- Provide overall strategic and technical leadership of the Project across all workstreams, including development of effective delivery model and work plan.
- Ensure technical quality across Project activities and workstreams.
- Provide effective leadership of the Team, including directly managing the Workstream Leads.
- Liaise with the programme management unit to ensure the activities are delivered at the intended quality
- Establish and lead a strong working relationship with the FCDO SRO and other relevant HMG counterparts.

Your Experience and Expertise

The ideal Team Lead should have extensive experience in the area of Third Party Monitoring (TPM) and/or monitoring and evaluation (M&E) for international donors, combined with a strong ability to manage client and local partner engagement. This includes extensive experience managing locally based consortia and research teams, supervising data verification, and managing risk in complex and fragile environments.

The Team Lead should also have;

- Experience working as Team Leader on large assignments and experience leading large assessment or evaluation teams
- At least 10 years' experience working in international development
- Familiarity with the Sudanese context, previous experience working in Sudan is ideal





- Knowledge of a broad range of qualitative and quantitative monitoring approaches
- Knowledge of data verification and quality assurance mechanisms
- In-depth understanding of FCDO's systems and mechanisms, having worked with the client on numerous projects.
- Significant experience working on FCDO-funded projects and programmes.
- Strong understanding and ability to carry out MEL and research, specifically political economy analysis research, evaluations, third party monitoring, and conflict sensitivity monitoring.
- Strong thematic experience in one or more of the following thematic areas: governance, security & justice, economic growth, and humanitarian assistance.
- Excellent ability to communicate, work in a team, and collaborate with individuals with diverse technical backgrounds and with external stakeholders.
- Exceptional written communication skills, with ability to independently take on writing of large reports using clear and compelling narrative.
