Integrity is the monitoring, evaluation, research and learning provider for DFID's Safety Support and Solutions Phase II (SSSII) programme, which seeks to protect vulnerable migrant populations along the Central Mediterranean Migration Route (see map) from harm. In response to COVID-19, as risks rise and assistance needs change, we have adapted our independent monitoring support to continue to track programming while ensuring beneficiary safety and well-being. 



COVID-19 AND A NEW APPROACH TO RISK MANAGEMENT


